

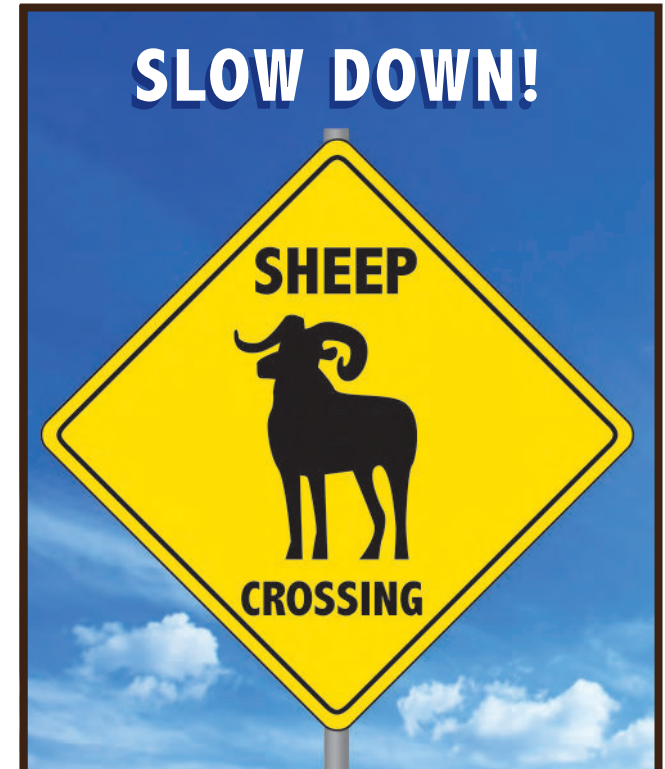
Use caution when driving near Thachàl Dhäl (KM 1649 – KM 1651, Alaska Highway). **Dall's sheep may be on the road at any time of year.** This is a winding section of road that cuts through important sheep habitat.

Slow down! Sheep, fallen rocks and stopped vehicles may cause accidents.



Report all wildlife collisions to the Yukon Department of Environment Conservation Officers.

Watch for Sheep on the Alaska Highway near Thachàl Dhäl & Respect Their Space

Dall's sheep use this narrow strip of land between mountain and lake as winter range, refuge from predators, and for important food sources including minerals. New plant growth in the spring and grasses growing on the recently exposed lakeshore attract sheep and put them in danger from vehicle traffic.



Sheep are protected within Kluane National Park and Reserve and have become used to people at a distance. Do not approach or disturb the sheep. **Never feed the sheep or any other wildlife.**
